History of Organ

"It is good to praise the Lord and make music to your name, O Most High." Psalm 92:1

The Organ Committee's goal was to find the best instrument for continuing the Lutheran tradition of joyously singing hymns and providing music for church services. The first of many meetings of this committee was held February 2, 1988, under the guidance of Music Director Karen Kentopp and Organ Consultant Dr. John Behnke.

The old organ, which had faithfully performed for many years, was worn out: leather parts and electrical components, due to age and pollution, were deterioriating. Repairing the old organ was considered, and several organ builders were consulted. The cost of repairs would have been about two-thirds the cost of a new instrument, with no long-term guarantee of continued service; nor would there have been any visible signs of this expensive work. Finally, confining the pipes of the main organ in the chamber next to the altar was a detriment to good acoustics. The consultants therefore confirmed the need for replacement.

Following extensive research, including trips to 18 locations (in and around Milwaukee, Sheboygan, and as far away as Omaha, Nebraska), and reviewing various types of instruments: electronic, blends of electronic and pipes, and straight pipe organs, the committee agreed that a pipe organ would provide music in its purest form and with the loveliest tone. The search also led to Master Organ Builder Martin Ott, whose instruments were meticulously constructed, and not only looked beautiful, but provided an outstanding tonal quality most appropriate for Pilgrim's needs.

Throughout these years continued efforts had been made, through written messages and informational meetings, to keep Pilgrim's members aware of the reasoning behind the final recommendation.

After much prayer and study the committee's proposal was submitted at the September 18, 1989, Voters' meeting, and the Voters approved the purchase of a new tracker action pipe organ from Master Organ Builder Martin Ott, at a cost of \$150,000.

In addition, approval was given to renovate and extend the balcony, at an estimated cost of \$20,000 to \$30,000. The larger balcony will accommodate the pipes of the new organ, retain space for the choir, and free up the former pipe chamber at the front of the church for other uses.

Dedication date of the new organ is October 4, 1992, with an organ recital date of October 25, 1992.

The Lord indeed graciously has led our congregation through this joyous endeavor. We pray He will bless the music of this beautiful instrument and the voices which will join in singing His praises.

Dr. John Behnke, Organ Consultant and Recitalist

John Behnke is Associate Professor of Music at Concordia University in Mequon, where he teaches organ and directs The Alleluia Ringers, Concordia's touring 5 octave handbell choir.

A 1974 graduate of Concordia-River Forest, IL, he received his M. Mus. in Church Music and Organ from Northwestern University, Evanston, IL, in 1978. His D. Mus. in Church Music and Organ was awarded to him in 1984 by Northwestern University where he was elected into the Alpha Chapter Pi Kappa Lambda, a National Honorary Music Society.

From August 1978 to July 1979, Dr. Behnke studied at the Westphalian Church Music Institute in Herford, W. Germany. At the Institute, he passed the A Exam in Organ with the grade of "1-Excellent".

Since his arrival at Concordia in 1986, he has built the Organ Program from six students to this fall semester's twenty-seven, the largest in the state of Wisconsin. He has been active in the Milwaukee area serving one year as Subdean (1987-88) and two years as Dean (1988-90) of the Milwaukee Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Dr. Behnke is a frequent recitalist and clinician having played 75 concerts in the Midwest and Germany, and enjoys composing and arranging, having organ, choral and handbell compositions published by Concordia, MorningStar Music, Hope, Augsburg-Fortress, National and Sassafras Publishing.

Organ Description

The new organ was built by the Martin Ott Pipe Organ Company, Inc., of St. Louis, Missouri, at a cost of \$150,000. It is a mechanical-action encased instrument, based in building principles upon classical German concepts. A mechanical-action, or tracker, instrument provides a direct linkage between the performer's hands and the pipes. The player directly controls the opening of the pallet, or the valve, that allows air to flow into the pipes. Trackers are the long and very narrow strips of cedar wood that make the linkage between the keyboard and the pallet. Except for the period of about 100 years beginning with the second half of the 19th century, organs for a period of 800 years were built along the tracker method or concept.

Mr. Ott and his co-workers spent approximately 3,400 manhours in constructing this instrument. The organ has a total of 1,323 pipes and the weight of the instrument is 9,200 pounds. Ninety-five (95) pipes are from the previous Moller pipe organ. All the pipes were scaled to suit the nave of Pilgrim Church.

After the organ was installed in the church, the pipes were voiced (their tone adjusted to fit the particular acoustic) and tuned. The largest pipe is 10 feet long, the smallest pipe is three-eighths of an inch. The organ has 26 ranks (sets of pipes) which are controlled by 20 tilting stop tablets. It has two 56-note manual keyboards and a 30-note pedal keyboard. The pipes are surrounded with an American red oak wood case. This case gives cohesiveness and direction to pipe tones.

The organ is placed to the left and right side on the balcony of the church. This split design enhances the three stained glass windows on the back wall of the balcony. The finish matches well with the other woodwork of the church. The wood used in the organ, milled at the Ott shop, is stained, lacquered and polished. All frames use mortise and tenon construction, proven to be the strongest joint for case frames. The mechanical key action is made of cedar for the trackers (the mechanical linkage between the keys and the valves). The stop action is electric. The wind chests are constructed of Baltic birch.

The two cases house the three separate divisions of the instrument, as well as projecting the sound of the pipes. To the left is the Swell division. This division has louvers in front which can be opened and closed by a foot lever, thus giving this division an extra dynamic in softness and loudness. The division is of great importance to accompany choirs and other musicians.

To the right is the Great division. As the name suggests this division is the dominant. The major organ sound comes from here. Divided between the Great and Swell are the Pedal divisions. These pipes are being played by the pedal board. All the bass pipes are located here. This division adds gravity to the organ sound.

The stops, or sets of pipes, are activated by tilting stop tablets. The use of these tablets regulates the many different sounds that the instrument will produce. The stop action is controlled by a computer combination action. This computer allows the various stop combinations to be preset and memorized. At the push of the single button it engages the preset stop selections.

The manual keys which control the pipes in the Hauptwerk and Schwellwerk are made of African grenadilla. The sharps are capped with cow bone. The pedal keys are made of red oak, with the sharps capped with African grenadilla.

The stop list, developed by Mr. Ott in conjunction with Dr. John Behnke, organ consultant, and Karen Kentopp, Director of Music at Pilgrim Church, was designed to make it possible for the organ to lead the congregation in singing the hymns and liturgy, as well as to provide adequate resources for solo literature, occasional services such as weddings, funerals, recitals, and choral accompaniment.

Martin Ott, Master Organ Builder (Orgelbaumeister)

Martin Ott, born and raised in West Germany in a family of organ builders, served an apprenticeship from 1960 to 1963 with his uncle, Paul Ott. He spent his journeyman years (1963-1969) also with his uncle and his father Alfred Ott, as well as in this country with Holtkamp Organ Company. In 1969 he successfully completed his Master Organ Building Examination in West Germany, and became a builder with Bosch Organ Company of West Germany and St. Louis. He formed his present company in 1973. Mr. Ott has a spacious shop in St. Louis equipped for building and servicing organs.
